

Major General Muniruzzaman (Retd) is a former career military officer and spent over 38 years in active duty. During his active duty tenure he has served at all levels of command up to the command of artillery brigade and infantry division, he was also the head of Bangladesh Artillery. He has served as the military adviser to the President of Bangladesh. He has been on the faculty of the Defense Command and Staff College and the National Defense University. He has extensive experience in UN Peace Support operations and had the distinct honor of heading the post election UN Mission in Cambodia.



General Muniruzzaman has a Masters degree in Defense and Security Studies from the National University of Bangladesh. He is a graduate of the Armed Forces Staff College, Malaysia and the National Defense University. He is also a graduate of the Defense Institute of Legal Studies from the US Naval War College, USA. He has also received professional education and training from a number of countries including USA, UK, China, Pakistan, India, Malaysia, Austria, former Yugoslavia etc. He was a visiting Distinguished Fellow at PRIO in Norway. He regularly publishes and has recently published book chapters in books entitled “Victory Among People – Lessons from Countering Insurgency and Stabilising Fragile States”, published by RUSI in London and “Trans National Security Threats in the Asia Pacific Region”, published by Macquarie University, Australia. His most recent op-ed article in the Daily Star was entitled “Climate Change: Threat to International Peace and Security”. His research interests include climate change and security, water security, post conflict peace building, information warfare, energy, security, etc.

General Muniruzaman is the founder President of the Bangladesh Institute of Peace and Security Studies (BIPSS), a think tank that focuses on the broad spectrum of security issues. He has also been the Director General and CEO of the government's leading think tank under the ministry of foreign affairs. He is a member of the Military Advisory Council (MAC) on climate change. He is member of a number of major international research and policy networks and sits on the board of Council for Asian Transnational Threats Research (CATR). He is a founding member of the network *Non Traditional Security – Asia*, based in Singapore. He is currently leading a number of research projects including a Norwegian government supported project on “Water Security in South Asia” and MacArthur Foundation study on “Climate Change and Human Displacement: Nexus between Climate Induced Migration and Conflict”. He is associated with the Minerva Energy and Environment Security study being done at the US Air Force University at Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. He is working as a core group member for setting up the UN University of World Security. He regularly advises a number of international organisations and governments on matters relating to international security and stability and is consulted by the international media for expert opinion on these subjects. He is a frequent speaker at international forums and has spoken at most major forums/conferences on international peace and security, including at Shangri La Dialogue, IISS, RUSI, EU, Peking University, NATO, Pacific Command in Hawaii, Beijing Forum, etc.
