

Rolain Borel holds a doctoral degree in agriculture (Dr. sc. tech.) from the ETH, Zurich. He started his post-doc career working in International Research Centers in Africa and Central America in the development of livestock and agroforestry production systems. At the same time as he joined UPEACE as a volunteer in 1988 to coordinate research and training activities in environmental conflict management involving local communities, he worked as an international consultant on subjects of rural development, social forestry, institutional strengthening and environmental conflict management. For the last 11 years, in addition to the coordination of four MA programs in the Department of Environment Peace and Security, he has taught in the fields of Environmental Ethics, Strategic Planning, Transformation of Environmental Conflicts, System Thinking, and Disaster Risk Reduction at the Local Level. Now retired as a Professor Emeritus, he will maintain a close link with UPEACE as a visiting professor. He is also a visiting professor at the European Peace University in Austria. One of his topics of greater interest at present is the relationship between climate change, sustainable development and conflicts.
