

Wybe Douma studied law at the University of Groningen (The Netherlands) and the Eberhard Karls University, Tübingen (Germany) and wrote his Doctorate thesis on "The Precautionary principle. Its application in International, European and Dutch Law". He is senior research fellow European Law and International Trade Law at the T.M.C. Asser Institute (The Hague, The Netherlands) and lecturer of International Environmental Law at The Hague University.



His working experience includes lecturing on European law, European and international environmental law and issues of sustainable development, Dutch administrative and economic law and international trade law at the University of Groningen and the T.M.C. Asser Institute, at numerous universities in the EU and its neighbouring countries, South America and Asia as well as for civil servants, judges, public prosecutors and diplomats.

He was team leader and senior legal expert in a wide range of environmental law projects, notably in Bosnia Herzegovina and Russia, and worked on numerous other environmental projects dealing mainly with the relationship between national and European law. In 2009-2010, he was seconded to the Legal Department of the Dutch Ministry of Housing, Spatial Planning and the Environment, where he dealt with EU and international environmental law issues.
